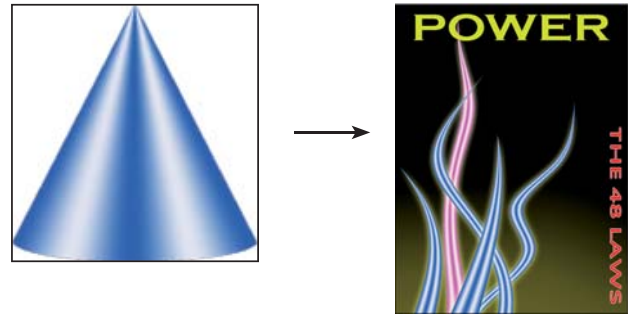


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3D Cone

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“ Creating 3D objects has always been important to many people. With the increasing demands for special effects, designers are constantly pressurized to produce unusual effects.

In this tutorial, learn how you can put together some 3D cones quickly, tweak them a little, and you are on your way to create a stunning poster. ”

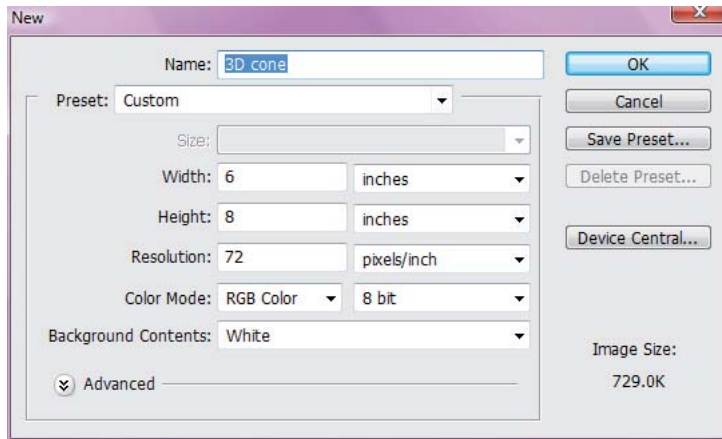


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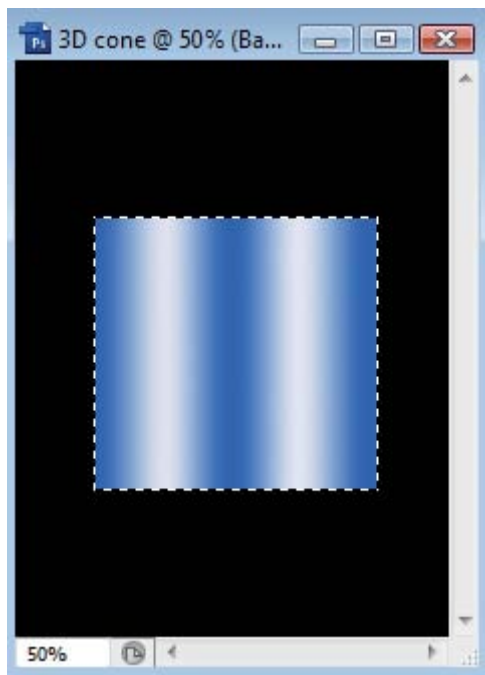
Most of us started our Photoshop project with a ready image, let's do something different in this tutorial. Let's create something 3D entirely in Photoshop.

Creating the base

- 1) Start a new blank document, with a dimension of about 6 by 8 inches.
Of course, you may use any other dimension of your choice.



- 2) Add a new layer and rename it **3D cone**.
- 3) Draw a rectangular selection of any size that you wanted.
- 4) Fill the selection with a gradient of your choice. To make a metallic cone, use the gradients from the metal library.



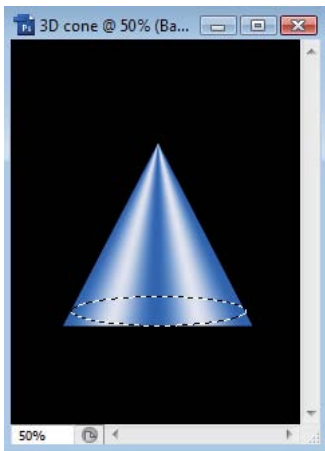
Transforming to create a cone

- 5) Choose **Edit > Transform > Perspective**.
- 6) Drag one of the top corners into the middle and press **Enter (Win)** or **Return (Mac)** to apply the transformation.



Creating the round base

- 7) A round bottom will definitely give our cone a more realistic appearance. Using the **Elliptical marquee tool**, draw an oval around the bottom of the cone.



- 8) Choose **Select > Inverse**.
- 9) Using a fairly large eraser, clear the bottom corners.



- 10) With the basic cone, you can use the Transform command to resize or the Distort filter to tweak the basic cone into a awesome poster.
